


Borough of Eastleigh Census 2021 First Results*



Sex

There were slightly **more females** than males living within the borough.



Dependency Ratios

ratio of those aged 65 and over to those aged 20-64 years


total dependency ratio had **increased by 7%**
child dependency ratio had **increased by 0.7%**
older age dependency ratio had **increased by 6.3%**

Age and Sex Profile

Below the age of 20
the percentage of males (11.9%) in the borough was slightly higher than that of females (11.2%).

At age 65 and over
the percentage of females (10.7%) was slightly higher than that of males (9%).

Population

The **Census 2021** population of Eastleigh Borough was

136,400 people

The population had **increased by 11,200** people since 2011, approximately **8.9%**, compared to 7.5% for the South East and 6.6% for England.

Ageing Population

The population had aged between the 2011 and 2021 censuses

shown by an **increase** in the percentage of individuals occupying the **older ages**, (65 and over) alongside a **slight reduction** in the percentage of **children** (0-19).

The percentage of the population aged **20-64 declined** slightly over the period, from **59.7%** of the population in 2011 to **57.3%** in 2021.

Households with at least one usual resident

There were **56,900 households** with at least one usual resident in Eastleigh Borough in 2021. This was an **increase of 4723** households since 2011, approximately **9%**, **higher than the South East** (7.1%) and England (6.2%).

Population Density

The borough had become more densely populated, with **1712 people per square kilometre in 2021**, compared to 1571 people per square kilometre in 2011, an increase of 9%.
