Notice of a diversion order confirmed under section 257 and Schedule 14 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (“TCPA 1990”)

STOPPING UP OR DIVERSION REFERENCE: The Eastleigh Borough Council (Unnumbered Presumed Dedicated Footpath at Pavilion Road, Hedge End) Diversion Order 2017 (“the Order”)

1. Eastleigh Borough Council (“the Council”) gives notice that it has confirmed the above Order without modification.
2. The effect of the Order is to:
 - (a) stop up the footpath being a presumed dedicated footpath at land at Pavilion Road, Hedge End, Southampton shown as a solid black line commencing from point A on the attached plan (“the Plan”) and running approximately north-east to point B on the Plan and measuring approximately 84 metres long and approximately 2 metres wide;
 - and,
 - (b) create an alternative footpath at Pavilion Road, Hedge End, Southampton shown as a dashed black line commencing from point C on the Plan and running approximately north-east to point B on the Plan and measuring approximately 78 metres long and 3 metres wide to the reasonable satisfaction of the Council for use as a replacement for the stopped up footpath.
3. A copy of the confirmed Order and Plan may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices at Eastleigh House, Upper Market Street, Eastleigh, Hampshire, SO50 9YN between the hours of 09:00 and 17:00 Mondays to Fridays (excluding bank holidays and public holidays) from 28 July 2017 until 6 weeks after the Council has certified that the footpath under article 2(b) of this notice has been created to its reasonable satisfaction in accordance with articles 3 and 5 of the Order. made under the TCPA 1990 has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order may within six weeks from the date of this notice apply to the High Court under section 287 of the TCPA 1990.

 - (b) create an alternative footpath at Pavilion Road, Hedge End, Southampton shown as a dashed black line commencing from point C on the Plan and running approximately north-east to point B on the Plan and measuring approximately 78 metres long and 3 metres wide to the reasonable satisfaction of the Council for use as a replacement for the stopped up footpath.
