
Beauty and nature

- Make a beautiful place to attract more children, parents and grandparents.
- Increase the time people spend there and their enjoyment of the space.

Improve the way different age groups are managed

Promote a free flow between age zones, whilst keeping age groups separated. Replace some of the railings with a more subtle, 'filtered' edge to the infants' play area. This would consist of mounds, planting and rocks. Parents would still be able to set boundaries for their younger children, but the existing play equipment would be in an attractive, stimulating and exciting setting. All roadside railings would be retained.









New setting

In recent years more recognition has been given to the importance of children being able to use their imagination in their play and at the same time, to be offered stimulating environments, contact with nature has real benefits for children's physical, mental and emotional health.

- Contact with plants and natural materials
- Mounds to run over; banks to provide/improve micro climate



• Thickets of bamboo frame spaces and shape and reveal views, whilst providing sensory stimulation. Bamboo to brush past, squeeze through and animate the sound of the wind.



• Rock areas to climb over and stepped rocks for sitting and informal events.



Supplement the existing rocks: a collection together would provide much greater play value.

- Rocks to protect vulnerable corners and will double as play features.
- Thoughtfully chosen planting to entertain and inform; tropical, exotic, fun and funky.




Mitigate noise

- Relocate picnic tables to more central location;
- Provide mounds and tree and shrubs to dampen noise pollution.
- Move the centre of the play area towards the centre of the park to reduce noise to nearest residences.



Play equipment







Restore and refurbish existing equipment and surfaces of value.

(See poster 2)

Remove and replace broken and poor value equipment. Introducing an embankment side gives the opportunity for a much higher and exciting slide than would be practical on a flat site.


The Fireman's Pole item is rather isolated and underused at present. However, it is very strongly built, so it is proposed to erect a net bridge/ramp from one of the new banks to increase interest and play value rather then remove it.


Funding will allow for the provision of some new items of play equipment and to enhance the setting of the equipment.




How the play area might be refurbished

This is a plan to show how the play area could be developed to look more attractive, with better facilities and an improved home for wildlife.


