## Matter 1

Action 1.1 <u>Check consistency between policies map and inset map – particularly figures</u> <u>5 and 6.</u>

- 1. The figures and inset maps in Local Plan have been checked for consistency with the Policies Maps. These include Figures 5 Countryside Gaps and Figure 6 Key Diagram. Changes for Figure 5 include an updated base map showing the urban areas, the deletion of gaps connected with the SGO and with site FO3 in Fair Oak and changes proposed in the Settlement Gaps study (MM27).
- 2. These changes are also brought forward in Figure 6 Key Diagram (MM34). In addition, the key diagram will update the site allocations symbols to reflect sites no longer in the plan and sites added such as Land west of Horton Heath (HH1).

## Action 1.2 Clarify notification of reg 19 extension (re website).

- 3. The Regulation 19 consultation in June August 2018 was extended as a result of problems with the online system which crashed for a maximum of 15 minutes on the day before the initial end of the consultation. The end of the consultation period was therefore delayed from 6 8 August 2018. Notification of this extension was published on the Council's website and social media channels and sent out to the Local Plan mailing list. A press release was also issued.
- 4. The screenshot below shows the information published on the Eastleigh Borough Council's Emerging Local Plan webpage. There were also banners publicising this extension throughout the website.
